



- Parental Criminality.

Over 70% of all policing arrests arise with a traffic stop as a trigger to wanted persons, evidence of other crimes, illegal drugs, etc. There are no simple answers without community investment, community involvement and community ownership in building that All American Community one step at a time.

- Keep records of serial numbers for valuable equipment
- Install security cameras and alarms

- Report any suspicious activity in your neighborhood
